1.2 Grants

1.2.1 Call for proposals restricted to Member States to support the improvement of border surveillance by enhancing cooperation between Member States in the framework of EUROSUR, including, whenever appropriate, cooperation with third countries (especially neighbouring countries)

LEGAL BASIS

Article 13 of Regulation (EU) No 515/2014

Priorities of the year, objectives pursued and expected results

- Collection and exchange of information on the European Situational Picture and the Common Pre-frontier Intelligence Picture of EUROSUR
- Support to Member States capacities to detect and track small vessels
- Cooperation with third (mostly neighbouring) countries in the framework of EUROSUR

Description of the activities to be funded under the restricted call for proposals

 Cooperation activities between two or more Member States supporting the regular and structured collection of information by Member States' embassies and consulates as well as by European Union delegations and offices which is relevant for maintaining the European Situational Picture and the Common Pre-frontier Intelligence Picture of

EUROSUR.

- Cooperation activities between two or more Member States supporting exchange of the situational picture of neighbouring external border sections between the national coordination centres of neighbouring Member States.
- Cooperation activities between two or more Member States supporting improvement of the technical and operational capability of the Member States to detect and track small vessels with a view to preventing irregular migration and cross-border crime, as well as to reducing the loss of migrants' lives at the external sea borders.
- Cooperation activities between two or more Member States aiming at supporting the information exchange and cooperation between Member States and third countries in the neighbourhood region for the purposes and in line with the requirements stipulated in the Regulation establishing EUROSUR. These activities may include actions related to developing, establishing, upgrading and maintaining bi-or multilateral information exchange and cooperation; regional networks; equipment for centres in third countries in the neighbourhood region which are similar to the EUROSUR national coordination centres in Member States, joint operations, including patrolling and surveillance activities; training, studies, pilot projects.

Any measures under this heading will be implemented in full coordination and complementarity with other on-going activities, such as the 'Seahorse Mediterranean Network' project, funded from the Thematic Programme for Migration and Asylum, existing initiatives promoting integrated border management in third countries financed by external assistance instruments as well as ongoing civilian Missions under the Common Security and Defence Policy in support of third countries' border security.

Indicative duration of the actions: up to 24 months

Essential eligibility, selection and award criteria

Eligibility criteria

These action grants will be awarded through a call for proposals restricted to the Member States participating in Regulation (EU) No 515/2014 in line with the objectives for 2015. Both mono-beneficiary and multi-beneficiary projects will be considered under this call.

The restricted call for proposals is justified by the specific characteristic of the action requiring the technical competence and a high degree of 'specialization' in the area of border management.

Selection criteria

The verification of the financial and operational capacity shall not apply to public bodies of the Member States in accordance with article 131(3) of the Financial Regulation.

Award criteria

In accordance with article 132 of Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 966/2012 of the European Parliament and of the Council³ (the Financial Regulation) and article 203 of Commission

1.2.2 Call for proposals restricted to Member States for a field experiment on the creation/management of a Schengen Masterlist

LEGAL BASIS

Article 13 of Regulation (EU) No 515/2014

Priorities of the year, objectives pursued and expected results

The authentication of an ePassport can only reliably be done through the use of Passive Authentication. This 'cryptographic' method verifies information in the ePassport against information previously collected from the Member State that issued the ePassport (the so called CSCA (Certified Supply Chain Analyst) certificate, which constitute the root of the trust chain). The collection of all these trusted Member State CSCA certificates is called a Masterlist. The concept and the structure of a Masterlist has been defined by International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO). Masterlists are produced and cryptographically signed by countries and made available normally through ICAO. At the moment, three Masterlists are published by Schengen countries in the ICAO directory, although only the one from Germany seems to be regularly updated.

The Commission will identify two or three Member States that do not have a Masterlist, but do have ABC (Automated Border Control) eGates installed in at least one airport. Under this 'field experimentation' action, these Member States will be invited to adapt the existing infrastructure to be able to use the new Schengen Masterlist (built by JRC) at border-control. This action for Member States is thus connected to the action 1.4.2 where the JRC will implement this draft Masterlist.

This 'temporary' environment will serve as a test-bed for future projects leading to full usage

Description of the activities to be funded by the grant(s) awarded through a restricted call for proposals on the basis of article 190 RAP

The activities are all related to the installation or modification of hardware and software products during this 'field experimentation' phase, and will rely on existing capacities in the Member States involved in this action.

Indicative duration of the actions: 12 months

Essential eligibility, selection and award criteria

Eligibility criteria

The two or three Member States will be identified and selected by the Commission based on:

- the absence of a Masterlist or its usage
- the presence of ABC eGates in an airport, actually working for EU citizens
- the presence of Framework Contracts and service providers which can directly be contracted without the need for a National call for tender
- (optional tbd) the participation in the SmartBorders pilot

These action grants will be awarded through a call for proposals restricted to Member States participating in the ISF Borders and Visa for activities in line with the objectives for 2015.

The restricted call for proposals is justified due to the very limited number of eligible Member States, by the specific characteristic of the action requiring the technical competence and a high degree of specialization in the area of border management which are only available at the level of the competent authorities of the Member States responsible for border management.

Selection criteria

The verification of the financial and operational capacity shall not apply to public bodies in accordance with article 131(3) of the Financial Regulation.

Award criteria

In accordance with article 132 of the Financial Regulation and article 203 of the Rules of Application, proposals for an action shall be evaluated on the basis of the relevance, quality, cost-effectiveness and European added value of the proposed action.

Implementation

The action will be implemented directly by DG HOME.

1.2.3 Direct award of an action grant to support the development of a new model of uniform format for visas

LEGAL BASIS

Article 13 of Regulation (EU) No 515/2014

Priorities of the year, objectives pursued and expected results

The current uniform format for visas is based on Council Regulation (EC) No 1683/95⁵ and has not changed in design or lay-out for 20 years, ever since the Schengen members created it. Recently, many quite sophisticated forgery attempts were detected by several Member States and the visa sticker is deemed compromised. Germany has been selected to develop the new design and lay-out for the new uniform format for visas. Once the new technical specifications are set out in a Commission Implementing Decision, Germany will develop a "visa-kit" for every individual Member State, which will contain the drafts for the printing plates and all other technical material, which will enable the printing houses to produce the uniform visa sticker as close as possible to the others, so that there are no longer substantive variants of visa sticker in circulation. This will also ease border control.

Description of the activities to be funded by the grant(s) awarded without a call for proposals on the basis of article 190 RAP

Development of a new design and security features for the uniform format for visas and preparation for the implementation by Member States.

Indicative duration of the actions: 6 months

Essential eligibility, selection and award criteria

Eligibility criteria

This action grant will be awarded directly without call for proposals following an invitation to Germany to submit a proposal, in accordance with the provisions of article 128 of Financial Regulation and to Article 190(1)(f) of its Rules of Application.

The direct awarding of the grant is justified by the specific characteristic of the action

requiring technical competence and a high degree of specialization. The Commitology committee created by Article 6 of Regulation (EC) 1683/95 (Article 6 committee) created a subgroup for the creation of a new design for the visa and residence permit. Member States were asked to present their design proposals. Five Member States presented their proposals and in the following delegations voted for the best proposal. As a result Germany collected most votes for the visa and Spain for the residence permit. Germany has consequently been selected as being responsible for the technical specifications of the uniform format for visas and for providing the basis, enabling the other Member States to produce the uniform format for visas as closely as possible to the design chosen.

Selection criteria

The verification of the financial and operational capacity shall not apply to public bodies in accordance with article 131(3) of the Financial Regulation.

Award criteria

In accordance with article 132 of the Financial Regulation and article 203 of the Rules of Application, proposals for an action shall be evaluated on the basis of the relevance, quality, cost-effectiveness and European added value of the proposed action.

Implementation

The action will be implemented directly by DG HOME.

1.2.4 Direct award of action grants to provide emergency assistance

LEGAL BASIS

Article 13 of Regulation (EU) No 515/2014

Priorities of the year, objectives pursued and expected results

- To address the urgent and exceptional migratory pressure faced by some Member States at their external borders
- Enhance solidarity by providing additional support to address emergency situations at the EU external border

Description and objective of the assistance to be provided

The ISF Borders and Visa shall provide financial assistance to address urgent and specific needs in the event of an emergency situation, resulting from an urgent and exceptional

pressure where a large or disproportionate number of third country nationals cross or are expected to cross the external border of one or more Member States or any other duly substantiated situation requiring urgent action at external borders.

The indicative maximum duration of the grant will be 12 months.

Essential eligibility, selection and award criteria

Eligibility criteria

- Applications for emergency assistance can be submitted only by Member States, International Organisations or EU agencies. Other entities can be involved in the implementation of the action as co-applicants.
- Emergency assistance may support expenditure which was incurred prior to the date of submission of the request for assistance, if this is necessary for the successful implementation of the action and it is demonstrated that the emergency situation prevailed earlier than the submission of the request.

Selection criteria

In accordance with Article 132 of the Financial Regulation and Article 202 of the Rules of Application, proposals for action shall be evaluated on the basis of the following selection criteria:

- Financial capacity Applicants and co-applicants must have stable and sufficient sources of funding to maintain their activity throughout the period during which the activity is being carried out and to participate in its funding.
- Operational capacity Applicants and co-applicants must have the professional resources, competences and qualifications required to complete the proposed action.
- The verification of the financial and operational capacity shall not apply to public bodies and international organisations in accordance with Article 131(3) of the Financial Regulation.

Award criteria

In accordance with Article 132 of the Financial Regulation and Article 203 of the Rules of Application, proposals for an action shall be evaluated on the basis of relevance of the proposal with regards to the objectives and the expected impact of the proposed activities on the situation in the countries concerned.

Implementation

The action will be implemented directly by DG HOME.

1.3 Procurement

1.4.1 Developing and implementing the Schengen Evaluation Mechanism

Description and objective of the implementing measure

These actions should support the preparatory, monitoring, administrative and technical activities, required to implement external borders and visa policies, including to strengthen the governance of the Schengen area by developing and implementing the evaluation mechanism as established by Council Regulation (EU) No $1053/2013^7$, in particular mission expenditure for experts of the Commission and the Member States participating in on-site visits. This includes also trainings linked to the implementation of the Schengen Evaluation Mechanism.

The allocation will in particular cover mission expenditure for experts of the Commission and the Member States participating in on site visits in line with article 13(2)(a) of Regulation (EU) No 515/2014. The allocation will also cover expenditures related to communication and IT equipment necessary to perform and document the visits as well as costs of the organisation of relevant training.

1.4.2 Small scale pilot testing the approach for a possible implementation of processes for the Schengen Masterlist management - Administrative arrangement with the Joint Research Centre (JRC)

Description and objective of the implementing measure

The actions implemented by JRC will support a small scale pilot testing the approach for a possible implementation of processes for the Schengen Masterlist management for ePassport authentication. This action is linked with the action in 1.1.4. The Member States involved in the pilot should be able to use in production the Master list developed by the JRC.

1.4.3 Improved coordination of research activities in the area of Home Affairs and in particular EUROSUR - Administrative arrangement with the Joint Reseach Centre (JRC)

Description and objective of the implementing measure

1.4.4 Study on the use of mobile devices 'apps' for third country national traveller's preborder regsitration or pre-border checks - Administrative arrangement with the Joint Reseach Centre (JRC)

Description and objective of the implementing measure

A new administrative arrangement with the JRC analysing the possibilities of using mobile devices "apps" for third country national traveller's pre-border registration or pre-border checks, in the framework of the Smart Borders Package implementation and with a view of facilitating the border control process while ensuring a high security level.
