Practices without this link cannot be included in the RAN Collection.</p>	<p>The Anti-Discrimination Office Styria developed 2017 the first mobile application against hate postings and hate crimes, BanHate-App. Via the BanHate app, online hate postings from the entire German-speaking area as well as offline hate crimes can be anonymously reported to the Anti-Discrimination Office Styria for initial legal assessment, documentation and prosecution. Therefore, it is necessary to inform exactly about the crime, the crime scene/the social media platform and prove it with footage or screenshots. The report will be checked by the team of the Anti-Discrimination Office Styria and pass it on the responsible authority.
