Ministerial data show an overall recidivism rate of 70% for general offenders.

In the CEC project, after completion of the entire programme the recidivism rate of those who participated lies at about 12-15%, thus being significantly lower than the average recidivism rate.

Similar data can be taken from evaluations of the APAC Prison Model in Brazil, by which the CEC model was inspired: for this reason the UN has defined APAC as the most effective rehabilitation method worldwide.

In a RAN PRISONS Working Group meeting in Berlin in 2022 the project aroused interest among the participants, stimulating a lively discussion.

# Sustainability and transferability (maximum of 200 words)

The costs of the project are now borne fully by the Community Pope John XXIII but are much lower than those in the prison: a prisoner costs about € 200 a day in jail whereas a rehabilitee about €50 a day in our custody center.

The Project CEC was inspired by the experience of APAC, Association for the Protection and Assistance of the Convicted . The first APAC prison was created in 1972 in Brazil. The at the time new approach centers the human being and takes their experiences as a starting point.

Mario Ottoboni, the founder of this method claimed that APAC's objective is to kill the criminal and save the man, unlike the prison system, which kills the man and the criminal within him. APAC assumes that every person is capable of doing wrong but also of doing good.
