

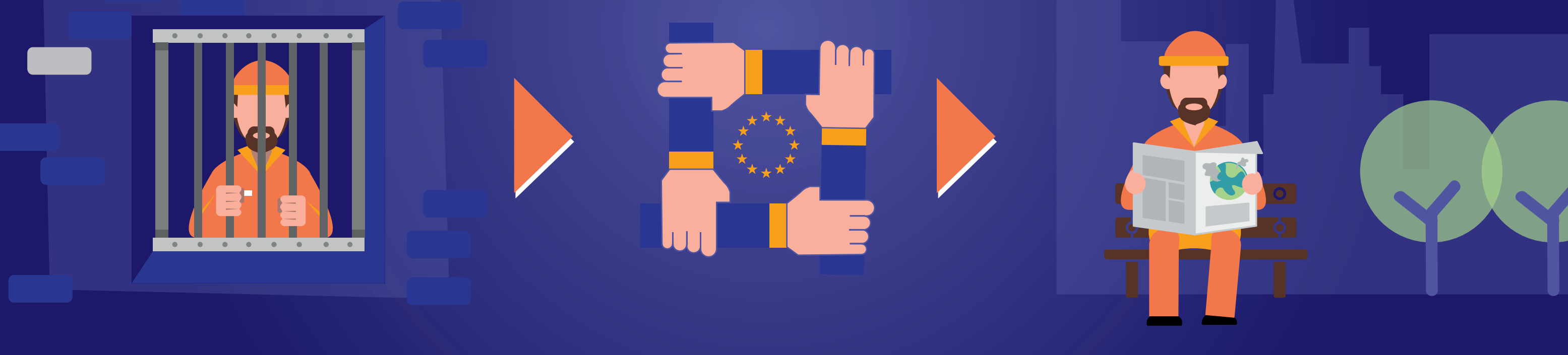

## RAN COLLECTION LESSONS LEARNED PRISON & PROBATION

### Lesson 1

Multi-agency cooperation is key during the transition period from prison to community. It starts in prison during the sentence.



### Lesson 2

Police, prosecution authorities and intelligence services should cover individual needs, risks and build trustful relationships



### Lesson 3

Prison regime choices should be guided by the aim of assisting violent extremist offenders to disengage from violent activities
