What does the process of radicalisation entail? - train staff to prevent, identify and deal with radicalisation in reception centres; - ensure the reporting of radicalisation to competent authorities. <p>After the training, staff members are able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - identify signs of radicalisation and prevent radicalisation; - react appropriately to radicalisation in reception centres; - know when and how to report radicalisation in reception centres. <p>Face-to-face training until the beginning of 2020 and since then (due to the COVID-19 pandemic) e-training via webinars.</p>

This expert's role is to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - train staff members (headquarters and reception centres) about radicalisation (how to identify it and report it); - coordinate the reporting of radicalisation between the reception centres and the competent authorities.
